Selected data for 2018 were revised as compared to those published earlier; in some cases data for 2019 are preliminary and may be revised in further issues.

Relative indicators for 2019 that were calculated using the number of population based on the 2019 population census results are not comparable with those for previous periods.

Data by economic activity are presented in accordance with the national classification of the Republic of Belarus OKRB 005-2011 "Kinds of economic activity" (OKED).

Data in value terms are shown at current prices.

STATE STRUCTURE

The Republic of Belarus is a unitary democratic social state governed by the rule of law.

The state power in the Republic of Belarus is exercised on the principle of its separation into legislative, executive and judicial branches.

The President of the Republic of Belarus is the Head of State, the guarantor of the Constitution of the Republic of Belarus, of the rights and freedoms of a human and a citizen.

The Parliament – the National Assembly of the Republic of Belarus – is a representative and legislative body of the Republic of Belarus, consists of two Houses: the House of Representatives and the Council of the Republic.


The executive power in the Republic of Belarus is exercised by the Government – the Council of Ministers of the Republic of Belarus.

The judicial power in the Republic of Belarus is vested in courts.





EMPLOYED POPULATION BY OWNERSHIP OF EMPLOYER
























STRUCTURE OF CROP-GROWING AND ANIMAL HUSBANDRY PRODUCTION BY TYPE OF FARM






STRUCTURE OF FREIGHT TURNOVER BY MODE OF TRANSPORT (% of total)










Inbound visits to the Republic of Belarus







(%)




COMMODITY STRUCTURE OF EXPORTS AND IMPORTS IN 2019








